#### **Contemporary Women's Issues**

Journal articles, reports, newsletters, and articles from alternative press sources.

#### **LGBT Life**

Contains the full text for hundreds of the most important and historically significant LGBT journals, magazines and regional newspapers as well as monographs and books.

#### Women & Social Movements in the U.S. 1600-2000

Brings together primary documents, books, images, scholarly essays, book reviews, audio recordings, Web site reviews, and teaching tools, all documenting the multiplicity of women.

## Africana Studies and Latina/o & Latin American Studies

#### **Black Drama**

Full text of plays by playwrights from the USA, the Caribbean, and English-speaking countries in Africa. Excellent source for Harlem Renaissance writers.

#### **Black Thought and Culture**

Contains the non-fiction published works of leading African Americans, and includes interviews, journal articles, speeches, essays, pamphlets, letters and other ephemeral material.

#### **Ethnic Newswatch**

Provides access to more than 200 newspapers, magazines and journals from the ethnic, minority and native press. Includes materials in Spanish.

#### Race and Justice Clearinghouse

An index to selected NGO reports, books and journal articles that focus on race and ethnicity and their interaction with the criminal justice and juvenile justice systems. Includes links to the full text of publications by the Sentencing Project.

#### Slavery and Anti-Slavery

Includes collections on the transatlantic slave trade, the global movement for the abolition of slavery, the legal, personal, and economic aspects of the slavery system, and the dynamics of emancipation in the U.S. as well as in Latin America, the Caribbean, and other regions.

#### World Scholar: Latin America and the Caribbean

Brings together primary source documents relating to Latin America and the Caribbean; academic journals and newsfeeds; reference materials; maps; statistics; audio and video. Covers politics, economics, religion, culture, international affairs, the environment, science and technology.

Our largest video collection includes almost 20,000 titles and over 200,000 video segments documentaries, dramas, and newsreels. Producers include Films for the Humanities & Sciences, Cambridge Educational, PBS, and BBC.

Includes archival footage, public affairs footage, and important documentaries.

#### Counseling & Therapy in Video 360 titles

Includes dramatized consultations, counseling sessions, documentaries, interviews and lectures

#### Criminal Justice and Public Safety in Video 760+ titles

Includes documentaries, training videos, and interviews illustrating the strategies, techniques, and experiences of professionals in the criminal justice system.

#### Ethnographic Video Online 1,000+ titles

Coverage focuses on study of human culture and behavior and includes interviews, field notes, and study guides from working anthropologists and ethnographers.

#### Human Rights Studies Online 270 videos and 4,000+ documents

Provides comparative documentation, analysis, and interpretation of major human rights violations and atrocity crimes worldwide from 1900 to 2010.

# **Search Strategies**For finding resources on diversity issues

Tips & tricks to make your research easier with the help of library science.

## **Search using keywords**

This is the most intuitive way to search a database or catalog. From your research query, select a variety of possible keywords. Searching a combination of keywords will net expanded or focused results. You can power up your search using Boolean searching. To review:

gender **AND** discrimination Retrieves results containing both words gender **OR** sex Retrieves results containing either word

discrimination **NOT** race Retrieves results containing *discrimination*, but excludes results containing *race* 

discrimination AND (gender OR sex) Mix and match to get what you want

"gender pay gap" Use quotes for exact phrases (works in most databases)

# Browse subjects in the catalog

When you're searching for a book on a particular topic in **OneSearch** (or the classic catalog, CUNY+), browsing by Subjects gives you access to items you may not otherwise find by keyword search, such as older books whose titles use outdated language. Each book in our catalog is indexed with these subjects.

In OneSearch, click "Browse CUNY Catalog" beneath the grey search box interface. Then select "Subject begins with..." to explore subject headings.

These terms may not be intuitive or in current use. Here are some we have encountered that may be useful:

civil rights movements gender discrimination race awareness NOTE: "diversity" is not a cultural pluralism group identity racially mixed people subject in this taxonomy ethnicity hispanic americans sex discrimination indians Explore all library subject gay liberation movement transgenderism gays multiculturalism transgender people headings at id.loc.gov

Each subject is listed along with sub-headings. Click on the subject or subheading to see related books and media. Try searching for a combination of these subject headings with other keywords of your choosing.

# Find videos by subject in video collections

In Films on Demand, browse by Collections (top menu) or Subject Index (bottom right).

In **Alexander Street** collections, videos are categorized in two hierarchies:

Select: Disciplines (top) » Diversity » Asian Studies / Black Studies / LGBT Studies / Women's Studies

Or select: Advanced Search (top right) » Subject » Topic/Theme » Browse many topics, incl. many p



# **Embedding videos into your course**

The Library subscribes to many streaming video databases that offer full-length documentaries, dramatizations, archival newsreels, and more. Use these in your course with these instuctions, specific to the video source:

**Embedding Films on Demand videos:** click 'Embed' and copy the 'Best for LMS' code. In Blackboard, create a new item in your course content. In the text window, click the HTML button, then paste in the code.

Linking to Alexander Street Press videos: embedding does not always seem to work for ASP videos, but you can click 'Embed/Link' and copy the permalink (not the embed code). In Blackboard, create a new web link in your course content. Paste the permalink into the URL box.
